AIS 232 Museums and American Indians (3) Introduction to museum anthropology and current developments in tribal and non-tribal museums with special attention to ideology of displays and repatriation.

18 units from:

ANT 102 Studying Cultures (3) Introduction to culture and society: technology, social organization, and ideology.

ANT 250 Principles of Archaeology (3) Method, theory, goals and history of archaeology as a subdiscipline of anthropology

ANT 351 Southwestern Archaeology (3) Origins, characteristics, and relationships of the prehistoric cultures of the American Southwest.

ANT 359W Proseminar in Archaeology (4) Method and theory in archaeology; laboratory experience with major material classes. 3 hours lecture, 3 hours lab. *Prerequisite: Major in anthropology and at least junior status, statistics, or instructor's consent.*

ANT 365 Cultural Resource Management (3) This course will focus on Cultural Resource Management laws and "doing" CRM: project proposal writing, budgets, project management, assessment, report writing, and site preservation, protection and stewardship. Prerequisite for the course, ANT 3569W.

ANT 459 Indigenous Perspectives in Cultural Resource Management (3) This course introduces students to Native American perspectives regarding cultural resource management. Three main questions are addressed: who owns the past, who manages the past, and who tells the stories.

ANT 460 Applied Indigenous Cultural Resource Management (3) This course will focus on tribal case studies in cultural resource management across Indian country. A variety of case studies will be discussed from CRM laws that specifically pertain to Indigenous issues. Prerequisites: ANT 365 and ANT 459.
