POS 320 or AIS 320 Native American Politics and Policy (3) Examines development of political and policy relationships between Native American nations and the U.S. government, using a political, social, economic, and cultural context. *Prerequisite:* POS 110

POS 224 Public Administration (3) Overview of the organization and management of public organizations, with attention to the political setting in which government bureaucracies and public agencies operate.

POS 241 State & Local Politics (3) Politics and administration of state and local government in the United States; problems, structures, and services. This course satisfies state teacher certification requirements for teachers in Arizona for Arizona constitution only. SPW

POS 250 Introduction to Public Policy Making (3) Policy making in the United States and/ or other countries in a political, social, economic, and cultural context.

ECO 425 Economic Development of the Reservation (3) Problems of economic development of Indian reservations and possible solutions. Historical, legal, and social problems; political, structural and junior status.

3 units from:

PL 201 Introduction to Planning and Land-Use Principles (3)

Underlying principles for orderly environmental change in dynamic communities, zoning regulations, and land-use planning functions.

PR 272 INTRO TO PUBLIC REL (3) Overview of public relations as a management function, including planning, ethics, public opinion, organizational contexts, skills, and related disciplines and technologies.

3 units from:

POS 316 Congressional Politics (3) Studies US Congress, emphasizing the structure and politics of the legislative process. *Prerequisite:* POS 110.

POS 317 Judicial Politics (3) Studies the role of courts in the political system. Special emphasis on the legal, philosophical, and political factors influencing judicial decision making. *Prerequisite:* POS 110

POS 325 Public Personnel Administration (3) Theories and practices of public personnel management, from recruitment and selection to retirement, including motivation, evaluation, promotion, career development, organizations and negotiation, grievances, and termination. *Prerequisite:* POS 224

POS 326 Public Organization Theory (3) Dynamics of decision making in modern, complex organizations including the structure of bureaucratic organization, incremental and rational approaches to decision making, the influence of bureaucratic routines, and various strategies for increasing organizational effectiveness. *Prerequisite:* POS 224

POS 344 Environmental Movement (3) Examines the broad range of environmentalisms existing in the United States today. Covers varied experiences, motivations social and political critiques, organizational models, and political tactics.

POS 345 Environmental Law (3) Role of law in environmental management. Discuss major federal regulatory actions by examining legal cases.

POS 359 Environmental Policy (3) Political aspects of environmental problems, policy responses to those issues, and their impact on the human and natural environment.

POS 455 Political Ecology (3) Analyzes various green political theories and their positions on the nature of the ecological crisis, environmental ethics, ideology, policies, institutions, and political culture. *Prerequisite:* POS 344 or POS 359 or instructor's consent.

CJ 101 Introduction to Criminal Justice (3) Introduces the American criminal justice system: structure, processes, decision points, and procedure among law enforcement, prosecution, courts, and corrections.

CJ 415 Criminal Justice and Native Americans (3) Overview of criminal justice processes as they relate to Native American offenders, victims, and service providers. Prerequisites: junior status and CJ345W, or instructor's consent.
