PL 302 Environmental Planning (2) Planning for the implementation of environmental regulations and quality-of-life standards.

POS 359 Environmental Policy (3) Political aspects of environmental problems, policy responses to those issues, and their impact on the human natural environment.

ECO 325 Environmental Economics (3) Issues, theories, and policies including cultural, social, and ethical issues; theories of externalities, property rights, optimal depletion rates and sustainable development; and policy and regulation of environmental economic activity. *Prerequisite:* ECO 284 and junior status.

PL 306 Public Participation in Planning (2) Locational conflicts and values, planning dispute resolution, and community-participation techniques used in the public planning process.

POS 320 or AIS 320 Native American Politics and Policy (3) Examines development of political and policy relationships between Native American nations and the U.S. government, using a political, social, economic, and cultural context. *Prerequisite:* POS 110

POS 250 Introduction to Public Policy Making (3) Policy making in the United States and/ or other countries in a political, social, economic, and cultural context.

POS 314 Political Participation (3) Examines theory and practice of political participation in the United States. Content includes elections, grassroots campaigns, protests, and social movements.

POS 344 Environmental Movement (3) Examines the broad range of environmentalisms existing in the United States today. Covers varied experiences, motivations social and political critiques, organizational models, and political tactics.

POS 356 Race, Power, and Politics (3) Studies race, politics, and power from historical, theoretical, comparative, and public-policy perspectives. Content varies. Cross-listed as ES 356.

POS 361 Politics of Developing Nations (3) Investigates the political dynamics of nations undergoing rapid social change and economic development. Focus is on problems endemic to the nations of Asia, Africa, the Middle East, and Latin America. *Prerequisite:* POS 120

POS 455 Political Ecology (3) Analyzes various green political theories and their positions on the nature of the ecological crisis, environmental ethics, ideology, policies, institutions, and political culture. *Prerequisite:* POS 344 or POS 359 or instructor's consent.

POS 480 International Organizations (3) Examines global and regional organizations with emphasis on their political contribution to world order. *Prerequisite:* POS 120
